




Why does school quality matter?

Description	 Highly regulated Schools can vary in quality even within one district Sometimes have programs like Early College or Gifted and Talented that require special admission 	 Not as regulated as other public schools. Often based on a particular educational philosophy (e.g. focus on college prep or something else). 	
Admissions	Guaranteed admission for those who live in the "zoned" boundary	Not guaranteed, often lottery based or first come first serve	
Cost	Free	Free	

Different types of schools

Туре	Magnet	Private	
Description	 Offer something above & beyond traditional public, like a focus on a specific theme (e.g. arts, math, science). Often a part of the district (and hence regulated by district). 	 Not regulated by district Often have different curricula, extra curriculars, etc. Not all private schools are high quality — still need to do your research! 	
Admissions	Not guaranteed, often competitive and application / merit-based. Sometimes lottery-based.	Often competitive and application/merit-based. May also require specialized tests like the SSAT.	
Cost	Free	Paid (but scholarships are often available — e.g., <u>United World College</u> global high school program)	

Regardless of school, parental engagement is **CRITICAL**



Go on a tour of the school! Some things to potentially ask:


- Can I see some different classrooms in action?

- My child is interested in <X>. What programs are available at the school for this?
- My child needs extra help with <X>. How can the school help?
- How do parents get involved and shape the direction of the school?
 - Do you mind sharing the names and contact info of 2-3 other parents at the school who wouldn't mind sharing their views?







How much does a neighborhood matter?

Researchers from Harvard University, Brown University and the U.S. Census Bureau tracked children over 30 years

- Studied every neighborhood in the US
 i.e., where they grew up by census tract (even smaller than ZIP codes)
- Measured their income 30 years later and how this compared to their family's income when they were children



Mean Household Income at age 35 for Children in Low Income Families









WHERE Key Southwest Areas

Always research elementary, middle, and high school

- One high school often has several different elementary and middle schools that feed into it. This collective group of schools makes up a cluster.
- BEFORE relocating, call the district. Check which elementary and middle schools feed into the high school.
- There may be additional recommended school clusters for each school district than those listed in this presentation - please reach to ACCESS for additional recommendations.






